The Gospel of Mark Mark's is the first of the written gospels. It develops a narrative of Jesus from his early career, through the main points of his life and culminates in his death. And, as such, it sets the pattern for all the later gospel traditions. We have studied the Gospel on Wednesday nights; and now in Lent, we invite all to come, listen and learn as our distinguished speakers will share with us their knowledge of this gospel and how Mark speaks to them.

February 26 The Rev. John Bolton, Church of Our Saviour, Atlanta

Fr. John was born in the north of England and raised in Scotland. He was ordained to the priesthood in the Scottish Episcopal church and emigrated to the United States in 1973. He has served as a parish priest in Virginia and Georgia and has worked twice as a full-time hospital chaplain. Fr. John is a Licensed Professional Counselor (LPC) and has maintained a counseling practice in Atlanta since 1983. He serves on the Executive Committee for the Diocese of Atlanta, is a board member of the Institute for Ministry & Theological Education and a member of the Commission on Christian Faith Formation.



March 4 The Rev. Robyn Michelle Neville, Holy Trinity, Decatur

Robyn earned her BA from the College of William and Mary, M.Div. from Virginia Theological Seminary, was ordained in 2003, and has served parishes in northern Virginia and Boston, Mass. She received a Masters degree in medieval theology at Harvard, moving in 2006 to attend Emory University for a Ph.D. in church history. She is a Visiting Instructor in Historical Theology at Emory and Candler School of Theology. She is married to Damian Reeder.

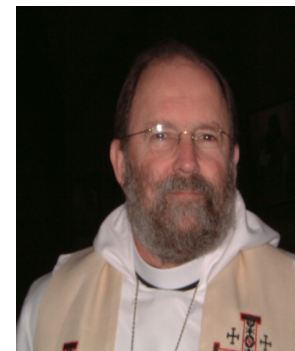


March 11 The Rev. George M. Maxwell, Jr., Cathedral of St. Philip

A graduate of the University of North Carolina and Duke University School of Law, George worked as a corporate lawyer for 20 years.
